# People are caring for longer

**75%** provide care for over 35 hours per week.

**50%** provide care for over 100 hours per week.

The average 18 year old will spend **12 years** of the rest of their lives providing unpaid care.

### More people are caring

**60%** of Gateshead's population will be an unpaid carer at some point in their lives.

**55%** of Carers said it took them over 1 year before they first saw themselves as an unpaid carer.

# Caring affects physical health

**47%** of carers reported having a disability or long standing illness.

**55%** of carers stated that their disability or long standing illness affects or limits how much they provide care.

# Caring affects mental health

Carers reported that their mental health condition has suffered due to their caring role, males (38%) and females (42%).

**50%** of carers do not feel recognised or valued.

### Carers are twice as likely to be unemployed

**10%** of carers describe themselves as unemployed which is greatly concerning when compared to the fact that **5.1%** of Gateshead's population is unemployed.

### Carers are getting older

83% of carers are aged over 51.



# There are gender differences in caring

**66%** of unpaid carers are female and **34%** are male.

The majority of men provide care only for their partner whereas women are significantly more likely to be caring for children, siblings, parents, as well as their partner.

Women who provide unpaid care are almost three times more likely to be in part time employment **61%** than men **22%**. Women are also significantly more likely to miss out on promotions and training in employment because of their unpaid caring role.
